Introduction

This articulation agreement is developed as a tool for advisement to assist in the transferability of comparable coursework from Onondaga Community College to parallel programs of study at Syracuse University.

Objectives

Syracuse University enters into this agreement with the following objectives:

1. To attract qualified community college students into Syracuse University.
2. To facilitate an efficient and smooth transition into Syracuse University from Onondaga Community College programs.
3. To provide a path of coursework at Onondaga Community College that is applicable to programs of study at Syracuse University.
4. To encourage academic coordination, faculty and administrative interactions, and student engagement.

Terms of Agreement

The establishment of this agreement, the two academic institutions agree to the following terms:

1. Onondaga Community College agrees to designate faculty and academic/transfer advisors to facilitate the advisement for students interested in transferring to Syracuse University.
2. Syracuse University agrees to accept the attached list of coursework into the Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Science programs; provided achievement be no less than a grade of C or better. The maximum number of transferable credit is 66 credit hours.
3. Syracuse University agrees to accept qualified candidates who meet the admissions standards of the desired program of study at the time of admission. Admission to SU is contingent upon a continued record of good citizenship and character. Admissibility into the program of study to be determined by the Undergraduate Admissions Office.
4. The agreement will be subject to annual review by both Onondaga Community College and Syracuse University, or in the event there are changes to the curriculum at either institution.
5. Onondaga Community College and Syracuse University will recognize and promote the agreement with prospective transfer students.
6. Faculty and administrators at Onondaga Community College and Syracuse University will continue to develop collaborative ways to engage prospective transfer students.

Articulation Agreement

Syracuse University Whitman School of Management and Onondaga Community College

Syracuse University's Whitman School of Management (SU) recognizes that courses taught at Onondaga Community College (OCC) should be considered equivalent to courses in Syracuse University's undergraduate management curriculum as follows:

Advising Notes for A.S. Program:

- Students are subject to Syracuse University’s normal admissions criteria. A grade of “C” or better is required for each course that transfers. Courses in which a grade of “C-” or lower has been received will not transfer.
- **Liberal arts electives** we recommend: COM 103, equivalent to SPC 325 (a required course). Other liberal arts electives should be distributed as on the checksheet attached. To fulfill SU’s global/diversity requirement, take any 2 of the following at OCC: ANT 152, HIS 104, HIS 204, HIS 212.
- As business electives, we **recommend** the following:
BUS 244, equivalent to LPP 255 (a required course) when student has also completed BUS 243 (6 credits total will transfer)
BUS 231, equivalent to SHR 355 (a required course)
- Although most students will not take BUS 295, those who are eligible to take the course will receive credit for SU’s SHR 247 (a required course)
- Students should wait to take Marketing at SU, since it is integrated with two other required courses, all 3 of which are taken in the same semester.
- Please see the attached checksheet, which shows how the courses above have been distributed.

This agreement supercedes all previous agreements and may be amended by mutual agreement of both parties.
