
Advising Notes:

- This agreement applies only to those students seeking a single major within the school of Management. Students interested in the Professional Accounting track, a dual degree with Newhouse, or a double major within the Whitman School of Management may not receive the same number of credits because of area requirements. Students interested in these options should contact the Whitman School of Management and arrange a meeting with a transfer advisor.
- Students are subject to Syracuse University's normal admissions criteria. A grade of "C" or better is required for each course that transfers. Courses in which a grade of "C-" or lower has been earned will not transfer.
- The Whitman School of Management does not require laboratory sciences. Science electives do not have to be in sequence.
- BUSA 2106, required for the Associate's Degree at GPC, does not fulfill a Whitman degree requirement. Based on other courses transferred in, the course may be used as a free elective.
- Please see the attached checksheet, which shows how the courses above have been distributed.

This agreement supersedes all previous agreements and may be amended by mutual agreement of both parties.


