

Articulation Agreement

Syracuse University Whitman School of Management and Sullivan County Community College

The intent of this agreement is to facilitate the smooth transfer and transition of Sullivan County Community College graduates into a bachelor degree program within the Whitman School of Management at Syracuse University. The successful implementation of the Agreement depends upon communication of its contents to all involved participants, and assumptions of responsibility by both institutions for such communication.

The agreement applies only to Sullivan County Community College students who have completed an Associate of Art or Associate of Science degree who wish to pursue a single major within the Whitman School of Management. Students interested in the Professional Accounting track, a dual degree with Newhouse, or a double major within the Whitman School of Management may not receive the same number of credits because of area requirements. Students interested in these options should contact the Whitman School of Management and arrange a meeting with a transfer advisor.

Students are subject to Syracuse University's normal admissions criteria. A grade of "C" or better is required for each course that transfers. Courses in which a grade of "C-" or lower has been earned will not transfer.

Syracuse University agrees to accept qualified candidates who complete the admissions standards of the Whitman School of Management with full junior status. Admission to SU is contingent upon a continued record of good citizenship and character. Admissibility into the program of study to be determined by the Undergraduate Admissions Office.

The Whitman School of Management does not require laboratory sciences. Science electives do not have to be in sequence.

Please see the attached check sheet, which shows how the courses above have been distributed.

The terms of this agreement apply to students graduating in 2010 and thereafter. Program changes by either institution will necessitate amendments to this agreement as appropriate.


This agreement may be terminated by either institution with one year's written notification.

Syracuse University's Whitman School of Management recognizes that courses taught at Sullivan County Community College should be considered equivalent to courses in Syracuse University's undergraduate management curriculum as follows:


